Marilynn Turner – **Budget**: In August, the Board approved an increase in the PCC Rock Creek budget of \$6500 reflecting directed donations previously received. This was brought to the Chapter at the September meeting and an email was sent to members. The following ballot was approved unanimously by a show of hands. "Should WCMGA amend the 2018 WCMGA Budget to increase the budget for the Education Garden at PCC-Rock Creek by \$6500 to be funded from restricted grants and pledges received thru July 31, 2018".

Marilyn Berti (presenting for Pat Simmons) – Fundraising; Modified Plant Sale: Marilyn did a quick presentation of Pat's PowerPoint presentation that was shared at the Sept. 
