<b>Begonia - Polka Dot</b>	Begonia maculata			Humid environment, moist	Bright, indirect Light	Toxic
<b>Begonia - Trailing</b>	Unknown			water only when the potting mix feels dry to the touch	Bright, indirect Light	Toxic
<b>Chinese Money Plant</b>	Pilea Peperomioides			Medium, allow to dry between waterings	Medium to Bright Indirect	Non-Toxic
<b>Coleus - Lime Green</b>	Coleus hybridus		Pinch frequently to keep bushy	Keep soil slightly moist, not soggy	Bright, indirect	Toxic
<b>Coleus - Molten Lava</b>	Coleus hybridus			Keep soil slightly moist, not soggy	Bright, indirect	Toxic
<b>Coleus - Red Stripped</b>	Coleus hybridus			Keep soil slightly moist, not soggy	Bright, indirect	Toxic
<b>Donkey's Tail</b>	Sedum morganianum			Soak thoroughly; allow to dry	Morning Sunlight	Non-toxic
<b>Figs, Fiddle Leaf</b>	Ficus lyrata	Can reach 10'		Warm, humid environment, water when top 1" feels dry	Bright filtered light	Toxic

<b>Jade - Trailing</b>	Senecio jacobsenii			Moderate to sparingly	Bright, indirect	Toxic
<b>Kalnanchoe - Mother of Thousands</b>	Kalanchoe diargremontia			Good drainage, allow to dry	Part Sun	Low
<b>Kalnanchoe - Red Flowering</b>	Kalanchoe crenata			Good drainage, allow to dry	Part Sun	
<b>Kalnanchoe -Lavendar Scallops</b>	Kalnanchoe fedschenkoi			well-drained, allow to dry slightly	bright light	Toxic

<b>Vicks Plant</b>	Plectranthus amboinicus	<i>Mounding</i>	Easy	Not much water, well-drained soil	partial shade	Non-toxic
<b>Wandering Dude</b>	Tradescantia Zebrina			Moist but well-drained	Full sun, partial shade	Mildly toxic
<b>Wax Plant HOYA - Plain</b>	Hoya carmosa			Moist, but not wet	High	Non-toxic
<b>Wax Plant HOYA - Varigated</b>				Moist, but not wet	High	Non-toxic
