Does best in the sand and/or on a hill slope, it does not do well in heavy, compacted soils where it tends to languish. On sandy hillsides it can be surprisingly lush and help protect from erosion. Bright red berries give some color late in the season and are eaten by wildlife. Drought tolerant when established.
G-GC	Fragaria chiloensis	Coastal Strawberry		X		4"-6"	2'-3'	X	X			X		Native groundcover. Attractive white flowers, and small strawberry fruits. Aggressive spreader. Drought tolerant with attractive flowers. Grows great across woody mulches.
G-GC	Sedum spathulifolium	Sedum	Cape Blanco	X	X	3"-6"		X			X	X	X	Evergreen groundcover. Yellow blooms May to June. Spreads laterally. Generally compact rosettes with a powdery bluish hue that transitions to reddish-purple as the plant ages.
