S	Ceanothus cuneatus	Buck Brush		X	X	3' - 13'	3' - 13'	X					X	Broadleaf evergreen shrub, with fragrant, creamy-white (sometimes tinted blue or lavender) flower clusters. Tough, fleshy, stiff leaves. Can be used in a hedge, thicket, or as a garden focus.
S	Ceanothus sanguineum	Red Stem Ceanothus		X	X	8'	3' - 10'	X	X		X			Deciduous. Easy to grow. White flowers late spring to mid-summer. Reddish stems and bark.
S	Ceanothus thyrsiflorus	Blueblossom Ceanothus		X	X	15'	8'	X	X			X	X	Evergreen with shiny dark-green leaves. Mature plants may reach up to 20' tall with a similar spread. Terminal clusters of small, blue flowers bloom in spring and fall. Prefers well-drained soil. Plant is a larval food source for multiple species of butterflies and moths. Flowers are attractive to insect pollinators; seeds are eaten by birds and small mammals.

S	Gaultheria shallon	Salal		X	X	1' - 5'	1' - 5'		X	X	X	X	X	Evergreen. Glossy, waxy foliage that remains beautiful year round. Fuzzy white or pink, bell-shaped flowers droop in spring soon to be replaced by bluish to black berries.

S	Potentilla gracilis	Northwest Cinquefoil		X	X	24"	24"	X				X		Plant features a clump of palmate, long-petiole, basal leaves with finger-like leaflets. Leaves have sharply-cut teeth and hairy white-tinged undersides. Five-petaled, rose-like, pale to bright yellow flowers bloom early summer.
S	Prunus virginiana	Chokecherry		X	X	15'-35'	15'-20'	X	X		X	X	X	Seasonally wet, moist to dry soil. White blooms April-July. Deep purple to black sour chokecherries. Nutritious berries to wildlife. Fast, easy grower.

S	Symphoricarpus albus	Common Snowberry		X	X	X	3' - 6'	3' - 10'	X	X			X	Deciduous. Blooms spring to summer. Tiny bell-shaped pink flowers, bloom in clusters - ripens to white berries in late summer to early autumn. Non-edible berries decorate plants all winter.
